CONCEPT NOTE

PROJECT VISION

Dialogues in Creation is a creative mentorship program led by Wyne Kirabo, bringing together a select group of emerging Ugandan creatives into a fully collaborative artistic process. This initiative aims to foster professional growth, artistic exchange, and international visibility for all participants, while strengthening the bridges between fashion, visual arts, photography, filmmaking, and modeling.

THE CORE OF THE PROJECT

At its essence, *Dialogues in Creation* invites Ugandan talents to reimagine existing Wyne Kirabo designs through a fully collaborative reinterpretation. Each creative team will co-create a new piece, blending their own artistic voices with Wyne Kirabo's aesthetic and mentorship, while contributing to a powerful collective narrative that celebrates Uganda's vibrant creative scene.

PARTICIPATION & MENTORSHIP MODEL

Participation is offered as a unique, complimentary mentorship experience personally led by Wyne Kirabo. While such guidance would typically require significant investment, this project is entirely cost-free for all participants. It is conceived as an opportunity for emerging Ugandan creatives to gain professional growth, portfolio expansion, international visibility, and exposure through media coverage, project documentation, and the East Africa tour interviews that will spotlight the work and its contributors.

All participants will have full access to the visual materials for their personal promotion and development. The garments created will remain with the designers as part of their portfolio. Any future commercial production based on these designs will remain under Wyne Kirabo's ownership, always recognizing all contributing artists as co-creators.

Harmony of Minds Uganda, alongside any additional partners or institutions who may join, will receive full acknowledgment for their involvement, adding further strength and visibility to the initiative. This project reflects Wyne Kirabo's personal commitment to showing how creative collaborations within Uganda, when approached with heart, rigor, and shared purpose, create real opportunities for growth, recognition, and international projection. Together, we uplift and celebrate the vibrant creative spirit of Uganda and, by extension, Africa.

Two multidisciplinary teams will be formed, each composed of:

- 1 emerging fashion designer
- 1 visual artist (painter or textile artist)
- 1 professional model (in collaboration with a local modeling agency)
- 1 Ugandan photographer/videographer (editorial shooting)
